IAEM releases details of exciting programme for ICEM 2012

The Irish Association for Emergency Medicine will proudly host the 14th International Conference on Emergency Medicine (ICEM) from 27th – 30th June 2012 at the Convention Centre, Dublin. This is the first time in a decade ICEM will be held in Europe and the first time ever outside the UK. Over 2,000 international delegates are expected, including: Emergency Department Medical Directors; Emergency Physicians; Emergency Medical Services (EMS)/Pre-hospital Physicians; EMS Directors; International and Humanitarian Emergency Medicine Experts; Emergency Nurses and Nurse Practitioners; Emergency Medicine Residents/Trainees and others engaged in the provision of emergency care.

The theme of ICEM 2012 is 'Bridging the Gap between Evidence and Practice' and an innovative academic programme based on the patient's journey through the emergency care system will deliver up-to-date evidence-based reviews coupled with original research of high quality.
